


THE CURTAIN RAISER



Only The Giver knows humanity's past... until young Jonas is chosen to learn the shocking truth.

Eleven-year-old Jonas (Matthew Minassian) lives in a seemingly perfect community with his family: Father (James Taylor), Mother (Laura Bradford), and younger sister Lily (Joyous Richards). There is no war, fear, or pain. All is "Sameness."

There also are no choices, as everyone is assigned a lifetime role at the age of 12. Some will care for the elderly, like Larissa (Danuta Jacob), who live in the House of the Old. In the Nurturing Center, others raise "newchildren." Others (Hannah Cobb, Mia Comas, Joy Newkirk, Darrell Riley, Camden Ruef, William Torres, Damon Vitale) serve as elders, instructors, laborers, birthmothers, and so on.

But as Jonas and his friends Asher (Sam Newkirk) and Fiona (Sandra McDonald) anxiously await their assignments at their Ceremony of Twelve, the Chief Elder (Linda Starkweather) makes a shocking announcement: Jonas has been chosen to become the next Receiver of Memory, the one person entrusted with the collective memories of humanity. Jonas will be trained by The Giver (Randall Moring), the previous Receiver of Memory.

As The Giver shares his memories and reveals the past, Jonas delights in snow and sunshine, love and colors, family and books. He also feels the pain of war and starvation, and discovers what happened when a previous Receiver of Memory, Rosemary (Grace Moring), mysteriously disappeared. And when Jonas discovers the shocking reality of his world, he must make one of the first and hardest choices of his young life. This haunting, thought-provoking drama is adapted from the best-selling young-adult novel, which inspired the 2014 film version featuring Jeff Bridges and Meryl Streep.

The Giver is directed by Chris Jorie. Stage manager is Ginny Riley. Set design is by Timothy J. Dygert. Costume design is by Eryn Brooks Brewer. Lighting and sound design are by Jeffrey M. Davis.

Notes from the

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Hello! The Theatre is really buzzing with activity right now! February has us finishing the final performances of *I Love A Piano*; holding auditions for *The Foreigner*; opening *The Giver*; securing the rights to the shows for our 2018-2019 season; touring Marion County schools with our literacy program; planning two fundraisers — our golf tournament and Get Up & Go drawing — and raising money for the auditorium renovation scheduled for this summer. It's exciting!

I hope you are planning to see *The Giver*. It's a wonderful, thought-provoking drama based on an award-winning book by the same name. The story was also the basis for a 2014 movie starring Meryl Streep and Jeff Bridges. We have an incredible cast and I'm sure you will be impressed. If you come, please take note of the curtain times. **Evening performances for** *The Giver* **start at 7:30 p.m. The Saturday matinees are scheduled for 11:00 a.m.** and the Sunday matinees are the usual 2:00 p.m. We are expecting a larger number of families and young audience members for this one, as the book is taught in many of our schools.

Speaking of the schools, this marks our 12th year taking two programs into the schools. Often news of the school tours are a surprise to our patrons since they don't happen in our theatre, but I thought you'd be interested to hear about them. In October, we toured the schools with a play titled Fit about fitting in, bullying, and acceptance. Fit was performed at 18 schools and was viewed by 4,004 students and their teachers. Our other program promotes literacy and started a 6-week tour of local schools in January. The Literacy Tour works with the media specialists in each school to highlight the work of specific authors and encourage students to read and enjoy their books. We choose different authors to feature each year. This year's tour features Rosie Revere, Engineer and the works of Andrea Beaty for students in kindergarten through 3rd grade. And for students in 4th through 6th grade, we are featuring Lois Lowry's The Giver to coordinate with our mainstage production. The Literacy Tour continues through February 23 and we are still accepting bookings in case you know of a school that may be interested. Currently, we have 23 schools booked. Last year's Literacy Tour reached over 11,000 students. Oh, and both in-school programs are offered free to the schools. The Theatre accepts donations and applies for grants and sponsorships to cover the expenses so that it is affordable for every school. A grant from Marion Cultural Alliance helped us with Fit, and grants from the Richard B. Salsbury Foundation and the State of Florida helped with both programs. Their generosity has allowed us to serve over 170,000 students in the 12 touring years!

Plans for this summer's renovation of the auditorium are well underway. The new, wider seats will be welcome, but unfortunately, wider seats also mean that we will have fewer seats. We currently have 401 fixed seats. The new layout will have 350 seats and four additional locations for patrons who need wheelchair access. We will be starting the season ticket campaign earlier this year to give us more time to work on the seat assignments. Current subscribers will receive a letter outlining the changes and listing the deadlines to renew. Please make sure to renew by the deadline this year to have the best opportunity to receive the seat assignment you request. In past years, the box office made hundreds of reminder calls when long-time subscribers missed the deadline, and it will be more difficult to do that this year. When assigning seats, priority will be given to long-time subscribers, season ticket donors, and donors to the renovation campaign. We are grateful for the support of all our subscribers, many of whom have been subscribers for 20, 30, or even 40 years.
