Twelve-year-old Ernie is always looking for a fast buck. This time, the middle-school tycoon stumbles onto a money-making bonanza: pet funerals for kids. He hires Dusty to decorate the burial boxes and Tony to dig the holes, but his prize find is a tomboy named Swimming Pool, who delivers a crying jag not to be missed. Business goes through the roof – until Ernie loses Swimming Pool over a raise and the whole venture unravels. It's only after

his own pet departs for the canine hereafter that Ernie realizes just how much more there is to life (and death) than making money. This is a special comedy about business, friendship, loss, and how we learn to express our feelings.

6 boys and 6 girls, ages 8-16, plus possible extras.

Monday, August 20 and Tuesday, August 21 at 5:00 p.m. Actors should prepare a one-minute comedic monologue for their audition and may be asked to read from the script.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the payment requirements?

A non-refundable deposit of \$20 per class must accompany all registrations and will be applied toward the class tuition. **Tuition must be paid in full the Friday BEFORE class begins.** If the balance has not been paid in full, your child's spot will be released and given to another on the waiting list. If you need to make other arrangements, please call the Education Director at (352) 236-2851, ext. 107.

Are classes refundable?

The \$20 deposit is non-refundable. If you must withdraw your child from a class before it begins, the last day the remainder of tuition may be refunded is the Monday before the first day of class.

Is financial aid available for students?

Financial aid is available for those who demonstrate true financial need. Applications are available at the box office and on our website. For more information, please call the Education Director at (352) 236-2851, ext. 107. Note: All students will be required to pay the \$20.00 deposit per class whether or not financial aid is awarded. To ensure that all students can participate, we are only able to award a maximum of \$200 in scholarship money per household.

What time should I arrive?

Please arrive approximately 10 minutes early, especially the first day of class, so you and your student may meet the teacher and fill out any additional paperwork.

What if my child needs to miss a class?

Please let us know in advance if your child will miss any classes so that teachers can adjust their lesson plans accordingly. Refunds cannot be made for missed classes.

Can parents sit in and watch the class?

To help students let go of their inhibitions, we encourage parents not to accompany their child to class. You may either wait in the lobby (we have wi-fi!), or leave and pick up your child at the end of class. If you have questions about observing a class, please ask to speak to the Director of Education or class instructor.

What time should I pick up my child?

Parents should arrive shortly before class ends to pick up their student. The pick-up/drop-off point is the Theatre's front entrance. Our first priority is your child's safety. Students will not be permitted to wait outside. Please be prompt.

Will there be a performance at the end of classes?

Some have a "Sharing Day" on the last day of class for family and friends that may wish to observe. This may be an informal performance, a reading of a script, or they might simply share something the class has worked on. **NOT EVERY CLASS WILL PRESENT A "PLAY" OR OTHER PERFORMANCE FOR SHARING DAY.** Each instructor will design a sharing day based on the needs and skills of the class. If a performance is planned for sharing day, it is intended to be very informal and almost always done without lights, sets, props, or costumes.

Will my child need to memorize lines?

Memorization is encouraged for most presentations. Assisting your child in memorization is a wonderful shared experience, especially for children with limited reading skills. If a performance of a short play is planned, you can expect some prompting, directions, or suggestions from the teacher. Please remember – this is an informal presentation, and the class has had limited time to prepare for sharing day!

Theatre skills are life skills!

Our classes are very carefully planned to match the skill and emotional level of the student. For that reason, we only place students in classes within their age range.

In order to ensure that students derive maximum benefit and enjoyment from the classroom experience, students who become disruptive or disrespectful will be removed from class with no refund of tuition.
